A. Adding counts to rhythms

We'll add counts to a few rhythms in 4/4. This will include sixteenth notes with our “grasshoppers” and “telephone” figures. As usual I'll ask for numbers in parentheses where the beats do not sound. See Worksheet #2 for review.



B. Making some scales

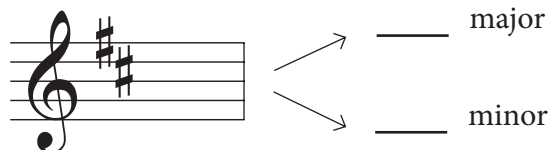
We'll spell out a bunch of major and minor scales, including the “harmonic” minor variant. These days a lot of you guys like to use key signatures, so I'll give you a choice of applying accidentals directly to the notes (like I've done here) or starting with a key signature. If you use a sig if has do be drawn correctly. :)

C. Identifying key sigs

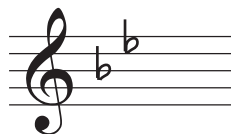
Here I give you a key signature and you identify both the major key and the relative minor key it represents.



D. Drawing key sigs

We worked hard on this so we might as well include it. After all the other stuff I'll have you draw two more sigs. There will be some key signatures on display in the previous section so that'll be a pretty good reminder of how they work. :)

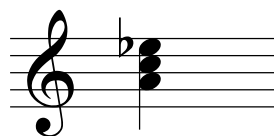
