
Seventh Chords + The Magic Flute

A. Writing Seventh Chords

Make these five seventh chords which range from the biggest kind to the smallest.



B. Roman Numerals with Seventh Chords

Here I give you a key sig, key indicator, and a seventh chord that might happen in that key. Give each one a roman numeral complete with the proper 7th-chord notation that indicates what kind it is.



C. Mozart Magic Flute Analysis

This is a passage from Mozart's opera *The Magic Flute*. The full orchestral score has been condensed down to look like piano music. Your job is to put a roman numeral analysis under the music.

The blanks tell you when the harmony has changed and a new roman numeral is needed. You may need to look at the notes that happen after the blank to see the complete chord.

The circles around notes indicate "non-chord tones" - melodic decorations that are not counted in your roman numeral analysis. You can ignore these notes!

You will need your ⁶ and ⁶ symbols to indicate some inversions. There is one seventh chord in there.
